The mission of the NMSU Grants Dual Credit Summer Academy Program is to provide academic enrichment and to foster post-secondary education of Cibola/McKinley County Service area high school students who attend Grants, Laguna-Acoma, Pine Hill, Thoreau, Tohajiilee, Tse Yi Gai, Zuni, Twin Buttes, and Ramah High Schools.

ELIGIBILITY

- ◆ Cibola/McKinley County Service Area Resident
- ◆ Enrolled at least half-time at the following high schools: **Laguna-Acoma, Tohajiilee, Grants, Pine Hill, Tse Yi Gai, Thoreau, Zuni, Ramah, and Twin Buttes High School**
- ◆ Incoming high school freshman to incoming senior
- ◆ 2.50 cumulative GPA or higher (preferred)

2. Complete the NMSU Dual Credit Packet

3. Send unofficial High School Transcripts to NMSU Grants.

Letter of recommendation from teacher, counselor, or tribal leader (non-related) is strongly encouraged as each Academy is limited to 20 spaces.
